Report

The Situation

The health is apriority sector in the human life foundation and TALO organization is implementing health protects in Somalia communities which affected by famine and drought lack of income opportunities and the rate of employment is high 60% these problems caused by stress and diseases among the society in Somalia particularly South and Central Somalia regions for that reasons TALO decided to work with the local communities and established to provide medical care and supports through primary health centers, mobile clinic remotes, in order to reach out in rural villages and IDP's champs and give awareness of hygiene and sanitation in the their villages and champs or settlements this project were supported to the host communities live in Bilked Banaadir and Afoye corridor IDP's communities since the facilities of the IDP's are not enough to them and TALO medical staff and professional lab techniques contributed to the project activities.

Poor environmental conditions, limited access to water and insufficient sanitation facilities act to worsen the impact of food insecurity on the population. Such conditions drive increased levels of malnutrition and outbreaks across the country. Somalia continues to experience outbreaks of measles, diarrheal disease (AWD/Cholera) and vaccine- derived polio, as well as malaria, high rates of malnutrition particularly concerning in the context of disease outbreaks and limited services, resulting in increased morbidity and mortality. Challenging conditions, violence and displacement subject the population, especially IDPs, to psychological distress resulting in social and mental health problems.

The Purpose of the project:

- Improve the pastoralist's small scale farmers affected by famine and drought in Balcad district and Banaadir, Afgoye Corridor IDP's champs host communities with
- care and supports, medical treatments in order to prevent the communicable diseases
 which spread in the communities and involved good hygiene and sanitation provision,
 medical supplies, & kid's to the women and young girls for better sanitation and hydrides

The Project Contents:

Provision of care and support to the IDP's vulnerable communities including free medical prescribed to the patients and provide medical care and support those are sick, malnutrition, mother and childcare, elders and youth other susceptible people to the communicable diseases and outpatients.

The Project Target group:

The numbers of the people were targeted 2100 populations in Balcad pastoralists and IDP's famers and 1000 in Banaadir and Afgoye Corridor IDP's host communities.

The Project: Location: Middle Shabelle region and Banaadir region with in Afgoye Corridor.

Challenges:

During the project facilitation some of the patients were complained shortage of medical health service and care and support less in their settlement champs the rate of Malaria and STDs is increased, the possibility of good health is decreased for the last years due to the gap of health facilities services and medical supports in the host communities and IDP's champs in Banadir

and Afgoye corridor

Recommendation:

TALO doctors and staff member's medical specialists recommended to increase the care and supports to the IDP's and host communities per week or per monthly and contributing those affected by famine and drought with provision health facilitates medical supplies and free treatments to decrease the possibility of communicable diseases in the host communities to

achieve sustainable lives and good health.

Conclusion:

TALO finally concluded the health facilities project in Balcad and Banadir regions of Afgoye Corridor of South and Cenral Somalia and the number of beneficiaries were reached directly 3100 and indirect number is approximately 4500 people. The project was successful completed and reached the goals and purposes sponsored by **PGPF** and contributed by **TALO** organization
